## CALL FOR JUSTICE PRAYER (Pearl)

Pearl Kupe, a lawyer for the past 35 years who has worked as Principal State Prosecutor in the Attorney General Chambers of Botswana and as Registrar of the Botswana Industrial Court briefly set out the function of the judiciary. Prophetically, she also explained that God is manifesting Himself as El Mishpat, God of Justice in this season globally.

She shared on Isaiah 33:22 which says "For the Lord is Judge, the Lord is Lawgiver, The Lord is King. He will save us. She discussed how the scripture declares God to be the source of all three arms of Government, the Judiciary, the Legislature and the Executive.

Pearl Kupe also shared on the differences between the justice of the world and of justice in the Kingdom of God. She led prayers and petitions praying for the Justice of God to manifest in the nations using *Psalm 97:2 "Righteousness and justice are the foundation of His Throne"*. In encouraging the meeting to pray for justice to be dispensed with righteousness, she shared on the recent October 6, 2020 victory which saw the prosecutor at the Health Care Professions Council of South Africa (HPCSA) withdrawing charges against charges against Pro-Life Doctor Jacques de Vos who was accused of having discouraged a woman from having an abortion.

She ended her prayer time session by sharing briefly on the Court structure in South Africa and praying for the courts the Constitutional Court; the Supreme Court of Appeal, the High Courts, High courts of appeal, Magistrates' Courts and Labour Courts . She encouraged the participants to also pray for all appointees to the Bench and for righteous people of integrity to be appointed to the bench. She closed the meeting with a call for constitutional reform. She shared that the constitution was the highest and supreme law of the land, and that all other pieces of legislation took their strength from it. Since Judges are required to implement the law of their land, it was important that the Constitution be aligned with the greatest constitution of all, which is the Word of God. The prayer session ended with a proclamation of Arise O God and defend Your Cause.
